Personal History

Alfred Willam AGOMBAR was born at Bethnal Green, London, Middlesex. on 22 July 1894 the son of Henry James and Agnes AGOMBAR nee DALBY. His mother died in 1898.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 17, Emmet Street, Miles Platting, Manchester,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Apprentice Cotton Dyer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 428, Old Ford Road, Bromley, Kent,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Manchester, Lancashire when he enlisted in the The King's (Liverpool) Regiment at Ashton Under Lyne, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 26 September 1917 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
