## Personal History

John PARTINGTON was born at Wakefield, Yorkshire in 1877 the son of Henry and Emily PARTINGTON nee KERSHAW who were married 20/05/1872 at Wakefield, Yorkshire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 108, Canal Boat, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 34 with the occupation of Master of Canal Boat.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Rose Ann PARTINGTON (nee WHITELEY) They married at Goole, Yorkshire on 14 March 1905. They had children: James Henry b.1901, George Arthur b.1904, Herbert b.1910, John b.1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Goole Steam Shipping at Goole as a Labourer

## Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Goole, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 19 August 1915. His last known address was Goole, Vermuyden Terrace, 4 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 18 November 1916 aged 39

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
