Personal History

George BATTYE was born at Hull, Yorkshire in 1891 the son of Daniel and Elizabeth BATTYE nee STOKELL who were married 1872 at All Saints, Sculcoates, Hull, Yorkshire. His father died in 1901. His mother died in 1901.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 17, Laurel Grove, Pulman Street, Hull, Yorkshire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of General Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10, Clarence Avenue, Bright Street, Sculcoates, Hull, Yorkshire,. He was aged 9

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Wakefield as a Washer Out

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Engineers at Hull, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 19 April 1915. His last known address was Hull, Grange Street, 3 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died on 18 November 1917 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
