Personal History

Middleton PEEL was born at Wavertree, Lancashire in 1886 the son of Thomas and Agnes Ellen PEEL nee WHITTAM who were married 1876 at West Derby Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1894. His mother died in 1894.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 7, Brindley Street, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 25 with the occupation of Railway Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Mount Pleasant Orhange, Myrtyle Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Inmate.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a White Metaller

He enlisted in the Northumberland Fusiliers at Horwich, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 14 April 1918 aged 32

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
