Personal History

Ellis BEAMER was born at Burnley, Lancashire on 28 December 1895 the son of James and Alice Maria BEAMER nee SMITH who were married 1891 at Holy Trinity, Burnley. His father died in 1904. His mother died in 1904.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 14, Roebuck Street, Burnley, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Tenter in Dye Works.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 19, Frankland Street, Burnley,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Burnley as an Extra Chain Horse Youth

Service History

He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Burnley, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 13 May 1915. His last known address was Burnley, Roebuck Street, 14 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 18 November 1917 in 44th Station Hospital, Kantara, Egypt aged 22 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
