Died of Wounds 3 December 1916 aged 21

Personal History

Thomas Alfred PIKE was born at Goole, Yorkshire in 1896 the son of Thomas and Alice PIKE nee GIBBINS who were married 1877 at Howden. His mother died in 1928.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 7. Providence Place, Goole. Yorkshire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Shipyard Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10. Mason Terrace, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Goole Steam Shipping at Goole as a Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Great Yarmouth, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 7 August 1915. His last known address was Goole, Yorkshire, Alexandra Street, 31 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 3 December 1916 in 33rd Casualty Clearing Station - France aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
