Personal History

Charles John Walter PIMBLETT was born at Mile End Road, London in 1888 the son of Henry and Jane Elizabeth PIMBLETT nee MILLER who were married 17/04/1883 at St. Dunstan and All Saints Stepney, Tower Hamlets.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 4, Davis Street, Poplar, Tower Hamlets, London,. He was aged 12 He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie Augusta PIMBLETT (nee DALE) They married at Mount Pellow (Halifax) Christ Church, Yorkshire on 8 July 1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Sowerby Bridge as a Labourer

Service History

He was living at Kings Cross, London when he enlisted in the West Ridings Regiment at Stratford. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 10 August 1914. His last known address was Romford, Essex, High Street, Palmers Cottages, 6 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 24 August 1914 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal, 14 Star and Clasp
