Personal History

Henry Alexander PIMBLEY was born at Horwich, Lancashire in 1893 the son of Thomas and Mary Alice PIMBLEY nee CARSON who were married 1888 at St. George, Bolton, Lancashire. His father died in 1935. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 66, Abbott Street, Horwich, Bolton, Lancs.,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Railway Foundry Apprentice.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Coremaker

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Engineers at Horwich, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 6 October 1915. His last known address was Horwich, Bolton, Abbott Street, 60 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 4 July 1916 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
