Personal History

Watson BEANLAND was born at Morton, Yorkshire on 7 July 1891 the son of Frederick and Annie Elizabeth BEANLAND nee SHARMAN who were married 29/01/1882 at St. Luke, Morton, Yorkshire. His father died in 1924. His mother died in 1924.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 9, Thomas Street, Denholme, Yorkshire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Woollen Weaver.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept, at Bradford as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Scots Guards at Bradford, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 8 April 1915. His last known address was Denhome, Yorkshire, Thomas Street, 9 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 September 1915 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
