Personal History

Thomas Edward POLLARD was born at Bolton, Lancashire in 1887 the son of Thomas and Ann POLLARD nee BEACH who were married 25/02/1879 at St. James, Bolton, Lancashire. His father died in 1923. His mother died in 1923.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 28, Smith Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Railway Rail Moulder.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 21, Smith Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Cotton Operatives Spinner Piecer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 2, Back Garden Street, Bolton,. He was aged 3

He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie POLLARD (nee GREENWOOD) They married at St. John, Bolton, Lancashire on 26 March 1905. They had children: James b.1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Bury, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 25 April 1915. His last known address was Daubhill, Bolton, Daisy Street, 44 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 30 May 1917 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
