Personal History

Percy POLLITT was born at Bolton, Lancashire in 1882 the son of Miles? and Ellen? POLLITT.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 8, Back Waterloo Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 29 with the occupation of Railway Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 12, Tipping Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 35, Broadsdale Street, Little Bolton. Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 9

He was a married man. His wife's name was Sophia POLLITT (nee HASLAM) They married at Bolton Register Office or Registrar Attended on 18 March 1905. They had children: Florence Haslam b. 1903 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Manufacturers Dept. at Bolton as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at the same place. on 29 March 1905

He is recorded as Killed in action on 31 July 1917 aged 35

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
