Enoch Hermann PRICE was born at Chorley, Lancashire in 1892 the son of Enoch and Elizabeth PRICE nee GRIMSHAW who were married 15/08/1876 at Halliwel Road Chapel, Bolton, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 4, Princess Road, Crumpsall, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 23, Williams Street, Harpurhey, Manchester,. He was aged 8 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Bury as a Clerk

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 20 October 1918 aged 26 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
