Personal History

Frank BEAUMONT was born at Burnley, Lancashire in 1884 the son of Joseph and Ellen Matilda BEAUMONT nee BULLOCK who were married 1884 at Golle, Yorkshire.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 4, Epsom Place, Wakefield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Wakefield as a Shunt Horse Driver

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Royal Rifles at York, Yorkshire. on 26 June 1905 and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 30 August 1914. His last known address was Wakefield, Marsland Street, 16 (Sister Esther - CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 23 October 1914 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
