Personal History

Bertram PYBUS was born at Hulme, Manchester, Lancashire in 1890 the son of Thomas and Mary Ann PYBUS nee KAY who were married 04/10/1876 at St. James, Gorton, Manchester, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 182, York Street, Hulme, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Brass Finisher.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 115, Bedford Street, Hulme, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 10

In the 1891 census the family were living at 15, Regent Street, Chapel Allerton, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 6 Months

He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie PYBUS (nee CLEARY) They married at Chorlton-on-Medlock Register Office or Registrar Attended on 26 March 1905. They had children: Bertram b.1912, Sydney b.1914, Annie b.1916

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Salford as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 9 November 1915. His last known address was Hulme, Manchester, York Street, Lavender Street, 21 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 March 1916 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
