

Private Thomas RAMSDEN

6973 10th Battalion Yorkshire Light Infantry Killed in action 1 July 1916 aged 30

Personal History

Thomas RAMSDEN was born at Clifton, Brighouse, Yorkshire in 1886 the son of Henry and Mary RAMSDEN nee WALTON who were married 11/02/1882 at Dewsbury, Yorkshire. His father died in 1929. His mother died in 1929.

In the 1911 census the family were living at White Cott. He was aged with the occupation of Knowl Lane, Mirfield, Yorkshire. Age 26, Railway Goods Shunter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 2, New Houses, Huddersfield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Woollen Weaver.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 5, Bradley's Buildings, North Gate, Huddersfield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 5 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Ellen RAMSDEN (nee HODGESON) They married at Huddersfeld, Yorkshire, on 21 March 1905. They had children: Mabel b. 1910

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Mirfield as a Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Yorkshire Light Infantry at Pontefract, Yorkshire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 1 September 1914. His last known address was Mirfield, Yorkshire, Knowl Lane, White Cottage (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 July 1916 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
