Personal History

Arthur RAMSEY was born at Leeds, Yorkshire in 1886 the son of George William and Mary Jane RAMSEY nee WHITTAKER who were married 21/07/1883 at St. Michael, Buslingthorpe, Yorkshire. His father died in 1940. His mother died in 1940.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 45, Burnley Road, Colne, Lancahire,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of General Labourer, Tannery.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 3, Marshall Street, Blackpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 In the 1891 census the family were living at 18, Buslingthorpe Green, Leeds,. He was aged 5

He was a married man. His wife's name was Lily RAMSEY (nee JOHNSON) They married at Burnley Register Office or Registrar Attd. on 24 March 1905. They had children: Clara b. 1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Nelson as a Signalman

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers at Colne, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 28 April 1916 in 8th Casualty Clearing Station aged 30 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
