Personal History

Samuel REDFORD was born at Salford, Lancashire in 1887 the son of William Henry and Emma REDFORD nee BERRY who were married 1878 at Salford Register Office or Registrar Attended.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Havelock Barracks, Dilkusha, Lucknow, India,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of Private King's Own Roy. Lan.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 95, Cook Street, Pendleton, Charlestown, Salford,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Cotton Worker.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 60, Cook Street, Pendleton, Charlestown, Salford,. He was aged 5 He was a married man. His wife's name was Susannah REDFORD (nee GRADY) They married at St. George, Charlestown, Salford, Lancs on 28 December 1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Pendleton as a Platelayer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 12 September 1914. His last known address was India, Lucknow, Dilkusha, Havelock Barracks (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 20 October 1914 aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal, 1914-15 Star and Clasp
