Personal History

John Alfred REDICK was born at Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire in 1883 the son of John and Rhoda REDICK nee PONTEFRACT who were married 30/07/1866 at St. Wilfred, Calverley, Yorkshire. His father died in 1924. His mother died in 1924.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 1, Naylor Street, Parkgate, Yorkshire,. He was aged 28 with the occupation of Electrical Crane Driver, Steelworks.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 4, Broad Street, Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire.. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Plumbers Apprentice.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 10, Old Causeway, Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire,. He was aged 8 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Amy REDICK (nee HICKMAN) They married at St. George, Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire on 3 September 1904. They had children: Adopted Daughter Ada Breen b.1907 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept at Sowerby Bridge as a Lasbourer

Service History

He was living at Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the Royal Army Medical Corps at Halifax, Yorkshire. on 11 August 1915 and embarked for France on 18 November 1915. His last known address was Norland, Scarr Head, Old Fold (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 July 1916 aged 33

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
