Personal History

Henry BECKWITH was born at Oswestry, Salop in 1884 the son of Harry and Rose Hannah BECKWITH nee BOWEN who were married 1883 at St. Oswald, Oswestry.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 9, Dickens Street, Weaste, Salford,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Sewage Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 9, Dickens Street, Pendleton, Salford,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Breadmakers Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 10, Orchard Street, Chorlton-on-Medlock, Manchester,. He was aged 7

He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie BECKWITH (nee HUGHES) They married at St. Luke, Salford on 25 March 1905. They had children: Rose b. 1912, Annie b. 1914

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Salford as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 2 June 1915. His last known address was Salford, Higher West Street, 3 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 4 June 1915 aged 31

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
