Personal History

Frank REGAN was born at Radcliffe, Lancashire in 1893 the son of Patrick and Mary Ann REGAN nee KEARNS who were married 1892 at Bury Register Office or Registrar Attended.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Bury as a Cleaner

Service History

He enlisted in the Grendier Guards at Bury, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 26 July 1915. His last known address was Bury, Fletcher Fold, 12 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died at home on 6 December 1915 in War Hospital, Newcastle, Staffs aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
