Personal History

Frank REGAN was born at Bolton, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 12, Cedar Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 25 with the occupation of Railway Platelayer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 28, Irving Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Piecer in Cotton Mill.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 12, Percival Street, Little Bolton, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 8 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth REGAN (nee LOFTUS) They married at Bolton Register Office or Registrar Attd. on 28 March 1905. They had children: Francis b. 1915

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Bolton as a Ballastman

He was living at Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Army Service Corps at the same place.

He is recorded as Died by accident on 8 May 1917 aged 32
