Personal History

James Houison RICHARDSON was born at Goole, Yorkshire in 1890 the son of James Houison and Hannah RICHARDSON nee SMITH who were married 1889 at Howden, Yorkshire. His father died in 1941. His mother died in 1941.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 76, Burlington Crescent, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Shipping Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 6, Burlington Crescent, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 11 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Clerk

He enlisted in the Royal Garrison Artillery at Goole, Yorkshire. He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 30 June 1917 aged 26 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
