Personal History

Harold RICHMOND was born at Leeds, Yorkshire in 1894 the son of John William and Sarah Ann RICHMOND nee PAWSON who were married 06/12/1884 at St. Matthew, Holbeck, Yorkshire. His father died in 1945. His mother died in 1945.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 1, Lane End Place. Holbeck, Leeds, Yorkshire.. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Pawnbrokers Assistant.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 1, Lane End Place. Holbeck, Leeds, Yorkshire.. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Ethel Madgeline RICHMOND (nee SACKS) They married at Maidenhead, Berkshire on 29 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Leeds, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 11 September 1915. His last known address was Maidenhead, Berkshire, Lukes Road, 38 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 July 1916 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
