Personal History

Peter RIMMER was born at Fleetwood, Lancashire in 1883 the son of Frederick and Eliza RIMMER nee MILLER who were married 27/04/1879 at St. Peter, Fleetwood, Lancashire. His father died in 1905. His mother died in 1905.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 10, Arthur Street, Fleetwood, Lancashire,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Railway Shunter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10, Arthur Street, Fleetwood, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Wood Machinist.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 10, Arthur Street, Fleetwood, Lancashire,. He was aged 7 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept at Fleetwood as a Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Fleetwood, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 14 February 1915. His last known address was Fleetwood, Lancashire, Arthur Street, 10 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 23 April 1915 aged 32

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
