Personal History

Thomas Miller RIMMER was born at Fleetwood, Lancashire in 1891 the son of Frederick and Eliza RIMMER nee MILLER who were married 27/04/1879 at St. Peter, Fleetwood, Lancashire. His father died in 1905. His mother died in 1905.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 10, Arthur Street, Fleetwood, Lancashire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Box Maker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10, Arthur Street, Fleetwood, Lancashire,. He was aged 9 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Fleetwood, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 14 July 1916. His last known address was Fleetwood, Lancashire, Arthur Street, 10 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 16 August 1916 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
