Personal History

Albert William BELL was born at Leeds, Yorkshire on 30 May 1891 the son of Joseph Henry and Mary BELL nee DOBSON who were married 1891 at Holy Trinity, Armley Hall.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 27, Fountain Street, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Errand Lad.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 1, Wilson Court, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 9

He was a married man. His wife's name was Lily BELL (nee HARTLEY) They married at Leeds Registered Building on 28 July 1914

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Leeds as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Scottish Borderers at London. on 5 January 1915 and embarked for Balkans on 25 May 1915. His last known address was Leeds, Park Lane, Fountain Street, 35 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 11 August 1915 in Dardanelles aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
