Personal History

Charles RODEN was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1888 the son of Charles and Elizabeth RODEN nee WEIR who were married 1886 at St. Aiden, Kirkdale, Liverpool, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 69, Seacombe Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Railway Goods Porter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 75, Keats Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 In the 1891 census the family were living at 11, Store Street, Kirkdale, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 3 He was a married man. His wife's name was Jane RODEN (nee WHITESIDE) They married at St. Mary, Kirkdale, Liverpool, Lancashire on 8 October 1911

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Liverpool (Great Howard Street) as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Liverpool, Lancashire. and embarked for France (date not known). His last known address was Liverpool, Seacombe Street, 69 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 17 July 1916 aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
