Personal History

Frederick ROEBUCK was born at Nottingham, Nottinghamshire in 1893 the son of William and Annie Lydia ROEBUCK nee BURROWS who were married 1881 at St. John the Evangalist, Miles Platting.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 86, Rushford Street, Longsight, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Joiner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 23, Cliffoed Rpad, Blackpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 8 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 15 January 1915. His last known address was Longsight, Manchester, Rushfored Street, 86 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 26 June 1915 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
