Personal History

Samuel Carlton ROWE was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1883 the son of James and Elizabeth ROWE nee GRAIMGER who were married 23/02/1874 at Wigan, Lancashire.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Ripponden Old Bank Bottom, Halifax, Yorkshire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 13. Ripponden Bank Bottom, Halifax, Yorkshire,. He was aged 6 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Sowerby Bridge as a Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Royal Rifle Corps at Halifax, Yorkshire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 13 August 1914. His last known address was Halifax, Yorkshire, Ripponden Old Bank Bottom (1901 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 14 September 1914 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
