Personal History

Edward RUTTER was born at Goole, Yorkshire in 1890 the son of Walter and Selina RUTTER nee JONES who were married 1880 at Llanelly, Camarthenshire. His father died in 1936. His mother died in 1936.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 10. Broadway, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Dock Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Wesley Street, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 11

In the 1891 census the family were living at 83, Weatherhill Street, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 1

He was a married man. His wife's name was Mabel RUTTER (nee STEAD) They married at Goole, Yorkshire on 25 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Goole as a Reserve Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Goole, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 12 April 1915. His last known address was Goole, Yorkshire, Cleveland Street, 4 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died on 30 March 1918 in St. John's Hospital, Hull aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
