***Personal History***

*William SANDERS was born at Southport, Lancashire in 1891 the son of George and Mary SANDERS.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 46, Larch Street, Southport, Lancashire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Day Porter at Hydro.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 3, Castle Street, Southport,. He was aged 9*

*He was a married man. His wife's name was Alice SANDERS (nee SHERIDAN) They married at Ormskirk Register Office or Registrar Attended on 30 March 1905*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Oiler*

***Service History***

*He was living at Southport, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Seaforth, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 19 May 1915. His last known address was Southport, Lancashire, Larch Street, 46 (1911 Census).*

*He is recorded as Died on 24 August 1918*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
