Personal History

Furbank SAVIDGE was born at Great Shelford, Cambridgeshire in 1881 the son of Furbank and Elizabeth Sarah SAVIDGE nee PECK who were married 06/02/1871 at All Saints Church, Cottenham, Cambridgeshire. His father died in 1883. His mother died in 1883.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 3, Bath Street, Huddersfield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 29 with the occupation of Railway Shunter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 12, George Street, Peterborough,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Railway Engine Cleaner.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Ely, Cambridgeshire,. He was aged 9 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept at Lockwood as a Railway Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Northamptonshire Regiment at Peterborough. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 12 September 1914. His last known address was Huddersfield, Yorkshire, Bath Street, 3 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 10 November 1914 aged 33

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
