Personal History

Elijah SCOTT was born at Sudden, Rochdale, Lancashire in 1891 the son of William and Mary Ellen SCOTT nee POWNALL who were married 22/03/1889 at St. Alban, Rochdale, Lancashire. His mother died in 1923. In the 1911 census the family were living at 212, George Street, Buckstone Road, Shaw, Oldham, Lancashire, He was aged 19 Cotton Piecer

In the 1901 census the family were living at 22, South Street, Rochdale, Lancashire,. He was aged 9
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers
Dept. at Todmorden as a Shunter

Service History

He was living at Accrigton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Rochdale, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 5 May 1915. His last known address was Church, Accrigation, Hagg Lane, Park View, 93 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 15 August 1915 in H.S. Formosa aged 24 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
