William SCOTT was born at Chorley, Lancashire in 1889 the son of James and Mary Ann SCOTT nee KEARNEY who were married 1881 at Chorley Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1939. His mother died in 1939.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 249. Lyons Lane, Chorley, Lancashire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 66, Anderton Street, Chorley, Lancashire,. He was aged 11 In the 1891 census the family were living at 53. Pall Hall Street, Chorley, Lancashire,. He was aged 1 He was a married man. His wife's name was Hannah SCOTT (nee BOLTON) They married at Chorley Register Office or Registrar Attended on 25 March 1905. They had children: Evelyn Frances b. 1913 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Storekeeper

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Chorley, Lancashire. He is recorded as Killed in action on 3 December 1917 aged 27 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
