Personal History

John BENTHAM was born at Parbold, Lancashire in 1888 the son of David and Martha BENTHAM nee RUTTER. His father died in 1938. His mother died in 1938.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 6, Abenthy Street, Parbold,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of General Railway Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Station Road, Parbold,. He was aged 12 In the 1891 census the family were living at Common Road, Parbold,. He was aged 2

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Fireman

Service History

He was living at Horwich, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment. and embarked for France on 4 May 1915. His last known address was Horwich, Abenthhy Street, 6 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died a prisoner of war on 27 October 1918 in Dusseldorf, Germany aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
