Personal History

Percy SHORROCK was born at Rochdale, Lancashire in 1898 the son of Thomas and Annie SHORROCK nee BARNES who were married 1885 at Blackburn Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1932. His mother died in 1932.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 4, Livingstone Road, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 12 with the occupation of $\frac{1}{2}$ Time Warehouse Boy & School.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 506, Whalley New Road, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 2 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Telegraph & Goods Clerk

He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Blackburn, Lancashire. He is recorded as Killed in action on 28 March 1918 aged 20 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
