Personal History

Thomas SMALLWOOD was born at Crewe, Cheshire in 1896 the son of William and Mary Ann SMALLWOOD nee MATTHEWS who were married 1892 at Congleton Register Office or Registrar Attended . His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 12, Watts Street, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Railway Boiler Maker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 77, Broad Street, Crewe, Cheshire,. He was aged 4

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Boiler Shop Apprentice

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Horwich, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 26 July 1915. His last known address was Horwich, Lancashire, Watts Street, 12 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 5 April 1916 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
