Personal History

David William Parker SMITH was born at Bilston, Shropshire in 1881 the son of David and Sarah SMITH nee DAKIN.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 3, Tomlinson Street, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 31 with the occupation of Railway Holder Up/Boiler Maker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 21, John Street, Bilston, Staffordshire.. He was aged 21 with the occupation of General Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Witemores Buildings, Bilston, Staffordshire,. He was aged 11 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth Jane (Rebbeca) SMITH (nee ROBINSON). They had children: Fred b. 1909

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Holder Up/Boiler Maker

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Navy.

He is recorded as Drowned on 3 February 1915 in HMS Clan McNaughton sank 03/02/1915 aged 35 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & Star
