***Personal History***

*George SNELGROVE was born at Salford, Lancashire in 1893 the son of George and Sarah Ann SNELGROVE nee OWEN who were married 1884 at St. Bartholomew, Salford. His father died in 1913. His mother died in 1913.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 11, Crown Street, Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Mineral Water Bottle Washer.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 83. West Union Street, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 8 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Salford as a Porter*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 19 January 1915. His last known address was Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire. Crown Street, 11 (1911 Census).*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 9 October 1917 aged 24*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
