He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Chorley, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 24 September 1915. His last known address was Chorley, Lancashire, Mill Street, 2 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 2 May 1916 aged 25
