Personal History

William Henry STANCLIFFE was born at Denby Dale, Huddersfield, Yorkshire in 1897 the son of Joseph and Lavinia STANCLIFFE nee HUGHES who were married 1895 at Halifax, Yorkshire. His father died on . In the 1911 census the family were living at 71, Stephens Street, Copley, Halifax, Yorkshire,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Worsted Mill Doffer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 23, Charlotte Street, Sowerby Bridge, Yorkshire,. He was aged 3 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Sower4by Bridge as a Porter

He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Halifax, Yorkshire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 23 September 1917 in 64th Casualty Clearing Station France aged 19 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
