Personal History

George Edward STOCKHAM was the son of William Thomas and Alice Matilda STOCKHAM nee SAISBURY who were married 06/07/1870 at Alderbury, Wiltshire. His father died in 1891. His mother died in 1891.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 21, Meadow Strreet, Wigan, Lancashire,. He was aged 35 with the occupation of Occupation Unreadable.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 40. Harriette Street, Broughton, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 26 with the occupation of Journeyman Baker.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 12. Eugene Street, Bristol, Gloucestershire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Occupation Unreadable.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Ann STOCKHAM (nee KITT) They married at St. James, Higher Broughton, Salford on 1 August 1896. They had children: Gladys b.1897, Mildred b. 1900, Thirza b.1902, George Edward b. 1905, Alice b.1907, Mona b.1914

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company at Bolton as a Leading Washer

He enlisted in the Royal Navy.

He is recorded as Died on 31 May 1915 aged 40

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal, 14 Star & Distinguished Service Medal
