Personal History

Thomas STONES was born at Farnworth, Bolton, Lancashire in 1894 the son of James and Betsy STONES nee YOUNG who were married 13/09/1890 at St. James, New Bury, Lancashire. His father died in 1902. His mother died in 1902.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 156, Campbell Street, Farnworth, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Junior Clerk Sawmill.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 86, St. James Street, Farnworth,. He was aged 6
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Secretary's Dept. at
Head Office as a Clerk

He was living at Farnworth, Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the East Surrey Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 26 April 1918 aged 23
