Personal History

Clarence William STOTT was born at Ripponden, Yorkshire in 1897 the son of Arthur and Sarah STOTT nee DYSON who were married 11/10/1894 at St. Bartholemewm Marsden, Yorkshire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 3, Elland Road, Bridge Terrace, Ripponden, Yorkshirem. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Ward Street, Soyland, Yorkshire,. He was aged 3

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Ripponden as a Joint Clerk

Service History

He was living at Ripponden, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the Royal Scots Fusiliers at Halifax, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 21 April 1915. His last known address was Ripponden, Yorkshire, Bridge Terrace, Elland Road 3 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds aged 17

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
