Personal History

James Samuel STOTT was born at Oldham, Lancashire in 1886 the son of Samuel and Ruth Alice STOTT nee HELLIWELL who were married 23/03/1885 at St. John, Oldham, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 24, Fenny Hill, Glodwick Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of Corporation Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 29. Harry Street, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Spindle Stretcher.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Ethel STOTT (nee KIDGER) They married at St. Mark, Glodwick, Oldham, Lancashire on 8 June 1906. They had children: Ruth Alice b.1907, Eveline b.1911, Ruby b. 1911, Ethel b. 1918

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Capstanman

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Oldham, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 3 September 1918 aged 32

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
