Personal History

Arthur SUGGITT was born at Slingsby, Yorkshire in 1873 the son of John and Mary SUGGITT.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 28, Saville Street, Mellington Street, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 37 with the occupation of Dray Man Railway.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Golden Hill Farm, Huttons Ambo,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Farm Servant.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Rose SUGGITT (nee HALTON) They married at St. Martin, Potternewton, Yorkshire on 28 January 1904. They had children: Mary Ann b. 1907

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Leeds as a Carter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Leeds, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 14 April 1915. His last known address was Leeds, Yorkshire, West Street, saville Street, 28 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died at home on 25 November 1915 aged 42

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
