Personal History

Horace BILLINGTON was born at Goole, Yorkshire in 1884 the son of William and Mary BILLINGTON nee NICHOLSON who were married 1868, Goole, Yorkshire. His father died in 1911. His mother died in 1911.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 182, Boothferry Road, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 26 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 83, South Street, Goole Yorkshire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Bank Clerk.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 83, South Street, Goole Yorkshire,. He was aged 6

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Goole as a Cleaner

He was living at Goole, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the London Regt (Queens Westminster Rifles) at Westminster, London.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 11 July 1916 in France aged 32

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
