Personal History

Fred SUTCLIFFE was born at Oswaldtwistle, Lancashire in 1893 the son of Robert and Louisa SUTCLIFFE nee HOUNSLOW who were married 07/08/1886 at St. James, Accrington, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 60, Pendle Street, Accrington, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Railway Engine Cleaner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 56, Pendle Street, Accrington, Lancashire,. He was aged 7 He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Elizabeth SUTCLIFFE (maiden name not known) Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Accrington as a Cleaner

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Burnley, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 28 December 1915. His last known address was Accrington, Pendle Street, 69 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 2 March 1916 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
