*Patrick TARMEY was born at Barfield, Lancashire in 1889 the son of Martin and Mary Ann TARMEY nee MACKIN who were married 1871 at Stockport Register Office or Registrar Attended . His mother died in 1916.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 51 Garnett Street, Barrowford, Nelson, Lancashire,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 51 Garnett Street, Barrowford, Nelson, Lancashire,. He was aged 12 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver Tenter.*

*In the 1891 census the family were living at 17, Corglass Street, Barrowford,. He was aged 2*

*He was a married man. His wife's name was Esther TARMEY (nee FITZPATRICK) They married at Cardiff, Glamorganshire on 30 March 1905*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company*

***Service History***

*He was living at Nelsom, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Engineers at Colne , Lancashire. on 10 May 1915*

*He is recorded as Died on 2 December 1916 in No.5 Stationary Hospital, France aged 28*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal*
