## Personal History

Samuel Ethelbert TAYLOR was born at Derby, Derbyshire in 1894 the son of George Frederick Martin and Phyllis TAYLOR nee BEDFORD who were married 17/05/1885 at All Saints, Wakefield, Yorkshire. His father died in 1964. His mother died in 1964.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 53, School Lane, Didsbury, Manchester, Lacashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 93, Thomas Road, Derby, Derbyshire,. He was aged 6
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Managers
Dept. at Radcliffe as a Platelayer

## Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Scots (Lothian Regiment) at Manchester, Lancashire. on 6 October 1914 and embarked for France on 5 May 1916. His last known address was Pear Tree, Derby, Derbyshire, Oliver Street, 50 (CWGC (Parents)).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 7 July 1916 in 26th General Hospital, France aged 22 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
